## **Brainstorming Wishes and Goals:**

- Bring diversity into the church in worship and education, i.e., Pastor Carlos as guest speaker
- Connect with Dillon Valley student/community, i.e., "adopt a grandparent"; weekly event for kids at the church after school; Mountain Mentors; Camp Compassion
- Display, present, share values with community: intentional life guidance, i.e., community meal midweek and evening prayer or worship (Wednesday is early release day at 3:05 pm). Needs: bus, shuttle, drivers as it is not safe for students to walk
- Develop opportunities for young families and singles including LGBTQIA+
- Increase LOTM's appearance in Google searches
- Non-weekend worship service, i.e., Holden Evening Prayer, outdoor service
- Honor people's engagement in ways other than Sunday morning church attendance
- Offer save haven, advocacy, education, spiritual resources for mental health and well-being
