The Overnighters – Depicted the lives of people chasing the dream of high salaries in the North Dakota oil boom, only to find that affordable housing was almost impossible to find. It narrated how one church opened its doors, allowing over 1000 people to stay.

Don't Tell Anyone - In an environment where silence is often seen as necessary for survival, 24-year old Angy Rivera steps out of the shadows to share her journey of being undocumented, an ordeal all too common in her community.

Making a Killing - Guns, Greed and the NRA – Tells the story of how guns – and the billions of dollars in profits made off of them – affect the lives of everyday Americans.

Health Care in Crisis - An evening of short film clips posing questions around the topic of health care in Colorado.

Beyond our Differences – With all the problems facing the world today – war, poverty, weapons, environmental degradation, starvation and overpopulation – people are longing for meaning. The film calls upon key religious leaders, politicians, and luminaries in their fields, to tackle the toughest issues in the modern age.

Chasing the Dragon – Features stark first-person accounts told by individuals or whose children have abused opioids with tragic consequences. Medical and law enforcement professionals discuss the full range of addiction issues.

Entre Nos – A mother moves her two children from Colombia to Queens to be reunited with their father, only to be deserted by him. What follows is their story of survival to triumph and all the heartbreak in between.

Truth To Power – The sequel to *An Inconvenient Truth*, the groundbreaking work of Al Gore and his team revealing the state of climate change today.

The Great Divide – The story of the Colorado River and the intersection of man with water from ancient to modern times.

Bullied – Victims of bullying often do not know where to turn. This film is their chance to be heard, as well as to hear the circumstances which may lead to someone becoming a bully.

Gunned Down - With first-hand accounts of school killings in Newtown and Columbine, and the shooting of Congresswoman Gabby Giffords, this film examines why, despite the national trauma over gun violence, politicians haven't acted.

Plastic Is Forever and **Straws** – Two films highlighting the issue of plastics in our oceans capped a weekend of activities which brought attention to the overwhelming pollution of our planet.
